**The purpose of this report is to provide Councillors with information on the updated position in respect of selection of the Chair of Causeway Coast and Glens Policing and Community Safety Partnership for Year 2 (2016 – 2017).**

The PCSP Chair is appointed by the council from among the political membership of the PCSP to the office of Chairperson for a 12 month period. The position of Chairperson is held in turn by each of the four largest political parties represented by the Council immediately after the last local government election.

At the Leisure and Development Committee meeting in June 2015, and subsequently ratified by Council, it was agreed that the position of Chair for Year 1 would be taken by DUP – Councillor James McCorkell.

The decision in respect of the party/member to take the PCSP Chair in the second year is required.

If d'Hondt is followed, the next party to take the position of Chair would be UUP, followed by SF in 2017-2018 and SDLP in 2018 – 2019.
