- **2.5** The number of applications received in March has risen to 120 with staff issuing 129 planning application decisions.
- **2.6** Resources continue to be targeted to reduce the over 12 month applications. Table 2 below provides a further breakdown of the over 12 month applications in the system. The weekly monitoring of these figures continues and staff are conscious of the need to prioritise their efforts in this area of work. The breakdown of over 12 month applications shows that while the number of applications over 18 months has remained relatively static, the number between 12 and 18 months has increased. An Action Plan for 2018/19 is being prepared.
