In order to more fully understand the situation which the council finds itself in, I would be grateful if the Council could provide me, under s104 of the 2014 Act, with the information requested in the attached Annex by 20 February 2020.

NI WATER FUNDING

Thank you for your letter of 29 January 2020 to convey the Council's concerns relating to the funding and governance of our water and wastewater infrastructure.

I am very much aware of the constraints in the waste water treatment system in many areas across the North and I share Council's concerns about the implications of this for economic development, housing and the environment.

Northern Ireland Water has developed its Business Plan for the period 2021-27 which sets out its capital requirements for water and wastewater and has submitted it to the Utility Regulator at the end of January. The prioritisation of works during any Price Control period is led by the Utility Regulator, in consultation with NI Water and its other statutory regulators. It is also subject to adequate funding being made available. As Minister I have inherited a range of capital pressures within which I have to work to invest in water and wastewater infrastructure, address regional imbalance, improve connectivity and address climate change.

Nonetheless, I am clear that finding solutions to allow greater investment in modern and sustainable water and wastewater infrastructure, for the benefit of local economic and community development, and to safeguard our environment, is a key priority. You will be aware that investment in wastewater infrastructure is a commitment in the New Decade New Approach Agreement produced by the British Government and Irish Government. I also welcome the fact that it is a recognised priority across all political

parties in the Assembly. I have raised the need for urgent investment in our water and wastewater infrastructure with my Executive colleagues and will continue to work with them to secure the funding required.
