1.0 Purpose of Report

The purpose of this report is to inform members that SEUPB have approved the PEACE PLUS Local Action Plan and to recommend that Council accept the £6.1m award and delegate responsibility for implementation and delivery of the Local Action Plan to the PEACEPLUS Partnership.

2.0 Background

In March 2022 Council nominated 11 Elected Members onto the PEACE PLUS Partnership using d'Hondt.

In April 2022 Council agreed the make-up of the PEACE PLUS Partnership which included the 11 Social Partners recruited through a public recruitment process.

In December 2023 Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council approved the PEACEPLUS Local Action Plan and it's submission to SEUPB.

The Local Action Plan contains 3 themes under which the programme will be delivered:

- 1. Local Community Regeneration & Transformation.
- 2. Building Peaceful & Thriving Communities.
- 3. Respect for all Cultural Identities.
