Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council has **granted** planning permission for the following planning application.

Application No	Location	Proposal
LA01/2018/0200/F	Lands approx 6km NE of Limavady which are located immediately to the S of Broad Rd (A37) in the Town Land of Gortcorbies, Co Derry/ Londonderry. Access is provided directly from Broad Rd where an unoccupied stone building is located. The Western site boundary is located approx 1.2km E of Keady Hill Quarry & the Eastern boundary is located approx 400m SW of disused quarry on Broad Rd which is adjacent to Springfield Forest.	Construction of a wind farm comprising 9No. wind turbines (maximum 149.9 meters to blade tip) & associated infrastructure including external electricity transformers, crane hardstandings, underground cabling, control building, substation compound, newly created site entrance, new & upgraded on-site access tracks, turning heads & all other associated ancillary works. During construction & commissioning there will be a number of temporary works including a construction compound with car parking, temporary parts of crane hardstanding & welfare facilities
