Clare Castle Community Archaeology Project



Over two weeks in June, Ballycastle Museum, in partnership with Queen's University Belfast's Centre for Community Archaeology QUB, carried out a community archaeology project outside Ballycastle as part of their Ballycastle Museum restoration and extension programme supported by The National Lottery Heritage Fund.

The aim was to search for evidence of the remains of Clare Castle, the 17th century home of the McNeill family just outside Ballycastle. Nothing of Clare Castle is visible above the ground, however, a probable site was identified through the use of archival records, historic aerial photographs and geophysical survey.

While the castle itself proved elusive, a late medieval house was uncovered along with plenty of objects including building materials dating to the 17th century, pottery and tobacco pipes, as well as a range of prehistoric flint tools.

Our thanks to everyone who has been involved in the project, from the land owners who generously allowed us to interrupt their lives, the great group of student archaeologists from QUB, all of the Ballycastle schools and the home schoolers who came out to participate, and our truly wonderful volunteers who came out every day to suffer the weather and help piece together another part of their local heritage.




'Harry Gregg: Dare to Dream', Brand new exhibition at Coleraine Town Hall to celebrate the life of Harry Gregg OBE

Ballycastle Museum Re-Opening


Causeway Coast and Glens Museum Services are pleased to announce that Ballycastle Museum will re-open for the 2024 season on Saturday 13th July!

'Limavady football Down the Years' exhibition features a selection of photographs from Limavady author, Gerry Robinson's recent book by the same title. Gerry developed this book to raise funds after hearing of a local woman requiring experimental treatment for cancer.

This free exhibition will open on 16th July and display photographs of

football players and teams in the Limavady area.

Coinciding with this exhibition is the Supercup NI, Premier Winners 2023 trophy and memorabilia now on permanent display within our new gallery space at The Roe Valley Arts & Cultural Centre.



The Nelson McGonagle Digital Archive



Now on display within our new gallery space at the Roe Valley Arts & Cultural Centre is a **Nelson McGonagle Digital Archive** where visitors can view Nelson's previous four publications which are now out of publication. Local historian, Nelson McGonagle has collected an array of images over many years, all chronicling the life and times of days gone by in Limavady and the Roe Valley.

The photos provide an interesting window onto the past and themes include sport social interaction and farming and street views, creating a fascinating insight into the history of Limavady and the Roe Valley, while highlighting interesting local characters from the 19th through to the 20th centuries. Outstanding success was achieved with the publication of Nelson's last four volumes. These were packed with nostalgic photographs and poetry and raised £16,000 for charities thanks to the generosity of local residents and businesses.

It is hoped his fifth volume will have the same success, with all

proceeds from this book going towards supporting Age Concern Causeway and Limavady Initiative for the Prevention of Suicide (LIPS).

Nelson's fifth and final book in his series, entitled 'Limavady and the Roe Valley – Sporting and Social Life' is available to buy through the Roe Valley Arts & Cultural Centre and is priced at £10.
