Summary

The establishment of a regional Care and Justice Campus, comprising the existing Secure Care Centre at Lakewood and the Juvenile Justice Centre at Woodlands, was a primary recommendation of the Review of Regional Facilities for Children and Young People in Northern Ireland, published in December 2018. It is also consistent with proposals put forward following a DoJ Scoping Study into Children in the Justice System, completed in March 2016. Throughout the development of the proposals, consultation has taken place with relevant stakeholders, including statutory authorities, academics, NGO's, staff and their representatives in both Lakewood and Woodlands, children and young people with experience of the Secure Care centre and Juvenile Justice Centre, and their parents and carers.
