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Purpose

The purpose of this report is to recommend the grant awards for the Christmas Festive Fund 2019-20.

Background

Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council launched the Christmas Festive Fund in 2015 to offer assistance to Community and Voluntary Organisations from the smaller towns, villages and hamlets in the Borough to help celebrate Christmas. This fund is specifically designed to mark the lighting of the Christmas tree and help facilitate outdoor festive celebrations within the Borough.

With the assistance of the Funding Unit and by using Council's online funding Hub, invitations for the competitive process were issued on 26 August and closed on Friday 20 September 2019. To be eligible to apply, organisations had be from within the Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council area, have a population of over 100 residents or have been allocated a Christmas tree from Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council.

Purpose of the Fund

To help local groups and community organisations to celebrate Christmas by organising events and activities in their local communities.

Level of Grant Aid

Grants of up to £250 are available for eligible projects.

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Outcome

The Funding Unit carried out the Stage 1 eligibility checks on 24 & 25 September. 20 applications were passed for scoring. The grant assessment panel met on 26 September to score the applications. The applications were assessed against the criteria above, as agreed by Council in November 2018 and stated in the guidance notes. Applicants were required to attain a score of at least 65% in order to be recommended for funding, in line with the agreed threshold.
