1.0 Background

The Northern Ireland Planning Statistics is an official statistics publication issued by Analysis, Statistics & Research Team within Department for Infrastructure. The Second Quarter 2017/18 Statistical Bulletin was published on 14th December 2017 providing provisional planning statistics for this period. It also provides a summary of Council progress across the three statutory targets for major development applications, local development applications and enforcement cases as laid out in the Local Government (Performance Indicators and Standards) Order (Northern Ireland) 2015.

2.0 Details

2.1 Website link 1 provides the link to the published bulletin and Appendix 1 provides an overview against the three statutory targets.

Development Management Planning Applications

Table 1 below provides a summary of performance in relation to the statutory target for major development applications and local development applications for Q2 and provides a comparison of performance against all 11 Councils.

 As is clear from Table 1 above, Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council received the highest number of major development applications out of the 11

Councils during Quarter 2, and received the 4th highest number of local development applications.

- 2.4 Performance against statutory targets remains an area for improvement and progress has been made in relation to the time to process local applications, improving from 21weeks in Q1 to 18.8weeks in Q2. With the ongoing recruitment of additional staff it is anticipated that this should show improvements in performance against statutory targets in Q3 and more noticeably in Q4 when staff will have been recruited and in post.
- 2.5 Table 2 below shows the year to date position at the end of Quarter 2 of 2017/18.

- 2.6 The Planning Department continues to maintain its position in the top half of the performance table in terms of applications received and live applications. Progress is also being made in relation to meeting the statutory performance target but the knock-on effect of the high volume of applications received since the beginning of this business year has had an impact on the issuing of decisions. However, as we work to reduce the number of applications in the system over 12months, this will inevitably have an impact on performance against targets especially in the major category where there are such small numbers of applications.
- 2.7 Although the time taken to progress applications exceeds the statutory target, this is mostly due to ongoing negotiations to resolve issues to achieve a satisfactory proposal that meets planning policies. This is reflected in the increase in the number of planning applications approved, raising to 96% year to date.

Enforcement

2.8 Table 3 below shows statistics in relation to enforcement in Q2. The high number of enforcement cases opened continued from Q1 into Q2. Of note is that of the cases

closed in Q2, 30.2% were as a result of no breach of planning control being identified.

2.9 Finally Table 4 shows the enforcement statistics year to date, with Causeway Coast and Glens succeeding in having the 2nd highest number of prosecutions and convictions out of the 11 Councils. Unfortunately we have just missed the target conclusion time of 70% within 39 weeks but the aim will be to achieve this target by end of this business year.
