5. AFFORDABLE WARMTH SCHEME – CONSULTATION CHANGES TO THE AFFORDABLE WARMTH SCHEME

Report circulated.

The Department for Communities has published a consultation paper entitled "Changes to the Affordable Warmth Scheme". The document outlines proposals for changes which were a result of a review of the Scheme following its first full year of operation. The Department has also published an Equality Impact Assessment (EQIA) screen of the proposals.

The consultation document and EQIA screen are available at www.communities-ni.gov.uk/consultations/changes-affordable-warmth-scheme. Copies of the consultation pack, including copies in alternative formats (on request) are available by emailing AWSConsultation@communities-ni.gov.uk or telephoning 02890515220.

The consultation period runs from 13 November 2017 to 16 February 2018.

Four changes have been proposed and these are as follows:

- The Department proposes that one installer, managing the installation of all measures to the household, becomes the preferred delivery method.
- The Department proposes to raise the income threshold to £23,000 for households with more than one person and reducing it to £18,000 for all single person households.
- The Department proposes that Disability Living Allowance, Attendance Allowance, Personal Independence Payment and Carer's Allowance are removed from the calculation of income for the Affordable Warmth Scheme.
- The Department proposes the removal of age-related and disabilityrelated eligibility criteria from the boiler replacement element of the Affordable Warmth Scheme.

The Affordable Warmth team have considered the impact of these changes and have included the proposed response in Appendix 1 (circulated) for Members' consideration.

6.2 Prohibition or Restriction of Public Roads: Special Events

During the report period two Orders have been made using the powers under Article 8A of Schedule 3A to, the Road Traffic Regulation (Northern Ireland) Order 1997 to facilitate Christmas Light Switch on Events in Ballymoney and Limavady.

A further four applications for Road Closure Orders to facilitate special events being held on the public road have been received, acknowledged and are currently being processed.

6.3 Publication of Council's Dog Statistical Returns on Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs Website

Council has received notification from Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs of their intention to publish Councils' dog statistical returns on the Department's website and to include a link to returns on the NI Direct Website.

The Dogs (Northern Ireland) Order 1983 requires Councils to provide information on a quarterly basis to the Department. The Department and Councils deal with a range of requests for dog related information for example correspondence cases, Assembly questions, media requests and Freedom of Information requests. It is anticipated that providing direct access to this information will reduce the volume of dog related statistical requests made to the Department and Council.

6.4 Evaluation of The Licensing of Pavement Cafes Act (Northern Ireland) 2014

Council are in receipt of correspondence from the Department of Communities, who wish to evaluate the legislation regarding pavement cafes and the implementation of this legislation by District Councils since its introduction in October 2016. A copy of the response to be forwarded on behalf of Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council was circualted. This highlights to the Department that there has been significant difficulty in implementing this legislation throughout Northern Ireland due to the significant concerns of disabled groups as there is a lack of consistent guidance with respect to minimum pavement widths to ensure that any implications for pedestrians and public safety issues are properly taken into account when considering an application for a Pavement Café Licence.

7 HOUSEHOLD AND MUNICIPAL WASTE RECYCLING/NORTHERN IRELAND LANDFILL ALLOWANCE SCHEME

Information report circulated.

The undernoted information outlines the annual recycling (including compost) rates achieved by council since its inception.

Council continues to make progress towards the EU statutory recycling target of 50% by 2020 as noted in the revised Northern Ireland Waste Management Strategy entitled 'Delivering Resource Efficiency' published in 2013 that sets the policy framework for the management of waste in Northern Ireland.

Northern Ireland Landfill Allowance Scheme

The Landfill Allowance Scheme (NI) Regulations (2004) (NILAS) sets targets by allocating annual limits on the amount of biodegradable local authority collected municipal waste (BLACMW) which can be landfilled by a district council. The Regulations place a statutory responsibility on district councils, in each scheme year, to landfill no more than the quantity of BLACMW for which they allowances.

The following table summarises council allocated allowances and utilisation:-

The NILAS allocations for the next three scheme years are 19,278 tonnes (2017/18), 18,170 tonnes (2018/19) and 17,062 tonnes (2019/20).

The EU Landfill Directive obligates Member States to reduce their biodegradable municipal waste to landfill to 75% of 1995 baseline levels by 2020.

In response to comments raised, the Director of Environmental Services advised it was anticipated that Council would reach its targets by 2020 following Council's roll out of brown bins from April 2018. A media campaign will accompany the introduction of the brown bins, leading on reducing the amount of food waste thrown away.

8. WELFARE REFORM INFORMATION LEAFLET
