1.7 Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) (NI) Order 1987

Articles 13 & 14 - Bye-Law for the Business of Semi-Permanent Skin Colouring

The above Bye-law requires any person who wishes to carry on the business of semi-permanent skin colouring to register themselves and their premises and to observe the Bye-law relating to the cleanliness and hygiene of premises, practitioners and equipment to protect customers against the risk of infection.

On 6 October 2016 Bronagh Donaghy made application to the Department to register to carry on the business of Semi-permanent skin colouring at Rural Retreat Beauty, 45 Laurel Road, Limavady.
